## Chrism Mass



A beautiful Chrism Mass was held at Newport Cathedral this week.

Held every year during Holy Week, the service couples the blessing of sacred oils with the opportunity for clergy and licensed lay ministers to reaffirm their commitment to God's call on their lives.

More than 100 people filled the cathedral to celebrate the blessing of the oil of the sick, the oil of the catechumens and the holy chrism oil.

During her sermon Bishop Cherry spoke of the moments when we find ourselves reflecting on where God has been in our lives; how we've been led to this time or season in life.

She went on to share her journey and the characters that have been part of her own 'God-story'.

## Lent Appeal 2024 - Our Parish Link

**Sanibonani:** I see you.

**Yebo:** Yes.

**Ninjani:** How are you?

**Siyaphila:** We are well.

This is a traditional Zulu greeting.

Many of you have followed the Lenten reflections on the Highveld. You may wonder if there is anything else you can do as well as supporting the Bishop's Lent Appeal. If so you may like to consider linking your parish or ministry area with a parish in the Diocese of the Highveld.

Tad Tony and I were very lucky when we came to St Illtyd MA, because there was a well-established link with the parishes of Nigel and eMbalenhle. Originally it was a link between these two parishes and Christ Church in Glyn Ebwy (Ebbw Vale). When we became a ministry area we decided to include the whole ministry area in the link. This has enabled us to come together to learn about our communities and raise funds for the link, like our South Africa night we held recently.



Every Sunday we pray for our link; that together we can bring our gifts into our communities to help us support each other and grow in faith together. It's not just about how we can help them, its about how they can help us too.

We were certainly enriched by our recent visit in November 2023. We were enriched by their community life. The way in which the small community of Nigel pulled together in difficult times during covid and since then, struggling to rebuild their community. They all had different roles and responsibilities, but they worked together to keep their community alive.



In eMbalenhle the community was strong and vibrant with lots of energy and willingness to improve their lives, but what was lacking were the physical resources. Tad Tony was shown the wonderful kitchen that was built with funds from Christ Church and which had been used to provide meals for the children as part of the Safe Park scheme. The Scheme provided a safe space for the children after school, to receive support, friendship and a meal – perhaps the only meal for that day.

Unfortunately, this has stopped, not because of lack of volunteers but because of lack of resources. They are desperate to get it up and running again. Next to the church there is a climbing frame, which is broken and needs repair. It looked quite dangerous, yet the children still play on it because they have nothing else.



These are two areas that we could make a difference by providing assistance. Even with the difficulties the communities are still strong and filled with hope.

We were privileged to join both parishes for worship. I joined the community in Nigel and Tad Tony went to the parish of eMbalenhle. In Nigel, the small multicultural congregation of mixed ages, with children and young people, were fully engaged in celebrating the Eucharist together with joy. eMbalenhle was also extremely joyful in their celebration of the Eucharist and the young people were actively involved in the various ministries which they undertook with care and reverence. This ranged from altar servers to those who exploded into liturgical dance after communion. They then invited Tad Tony to join in, which involved him showing off his Grandad moves. The congregation thought this was hysterical. Most of the liturgy in eMbalenhle was done in Zulu and the Zulu hymns were sung with enthusiasm and delight. Most of the hymns they knew by heart.



The welcoming atmosphere and the warmth of the communities was truly inspiring and infectious, and you didn't just walk out of Church you bounced out! We were provided with food and hospitality afterwards and this is a big part of the culture, even if you don't have much. What little you have is offered to your guest.



Both of us experienced the deep faith of the communities we visited. Theirs is a deep relationship with God. It was not a blind faith in God who will sort everything out, but a faith which believed that through our actions and efforts God will help us sort it out. No problem was too big that it couldn't be overcome by prayer. Their trust in God's presence within the community motivated them, inspired them and comforted them.



These are some of our impressions visiting our wonderful link parishes. We hope that our link will grow stronger in the coming years as we walk together in the light of God, as the Zulu hymn says:

Siyahamba ekukhanyeni kwenkos,  
We are walking in the light of God.

We are truly blessed to have link parishes, and we would encourage you to set up a link yourself in your own parish or ministry area.

## Archbishop's Easter message



Wales now has a new First Minister. Mr Vaughan Gething takes responsibility for leading the government in Wales and speaking for the Labour Party on matters of national interest. The challenges we face in Wales of course will require more than the efforts of one person however dedicated and resolute their intentions. With a general election likely this year the focus on Westminster should not cloud the need for transformation within all our communities in Wales.

I've been struck by the extraordinary efforts of so many this year who make a difference in their communities. I've come to know those who volunteer for Parkrun for example like David, in his eighties, who is there come wind or rain so that runners can participate safely. These unsung heroes whose quiet steady work in the background often goes unrecognized affect the fortunes of young and old. The potential for blessing others is seldom recognized even though they can be the important things in another person's life.

I am also struck even more by the work of Christians in our churches and chapels who share a radical faith which is rich and vibrant. This kind of faith is inspired by a personal experience of the Risen Jesus and takes its cue from the way Jesus touched the lives of others. I think of Pam who visits in her local care home and spends time talking and listening to residents about the things important to them or Frank who volunteers to open his local church so that people can come in and pray there. When we consider the real challenges we face across the world whether climate change, food security, wars or the instability of governments, it is easy to forget how profound the personal and individual touch can be.

Few will be expecting the new First Minister to solve all our problems. Indeed the very idea that change happens primarily because of political decisions seems tome



misplaced. What lifts us above the mentality of living for ourselves alone is an experience of selfless love. And this is what Easter offers. In the Easter story we see a love so great, it breaks through to captivate and win us to service.

May I wish you a Happy Easter and God's blessing.

# Behind Closed Doors: Changing the Story of Domestic Abuse



Clergy and interested people are invited to an event in Cardiff on **Friday 12th April**, jointly hosted by the Diocese of Llandaff, Restored, and Mothers Union, to explore the role the church can play in speaking up against domestic abuse and supporting survivors. This has been motivated by the stark statistic that one in four church-going women in England and Wales will experience domestic abuse in their lifetime, but just two in seven feel their church is equipped to support them.

Guest speakers will include Revd Dr Helen Paynter from the Centre for the Study of the Bible and Violence, and the team from Welsh Women's Aid.

There will also be a panel discussion/Q&A on the role of the church alongside public and third sector organisations,

**Journey to Net Zero**



Along with the rest of the Church in Wales, we are working to become Net Zero through a series of steps. This will involve the diocesan office, parsonages, churches and churchyards which form part of our wider culture as a diocese and province.

The next step of this journey is to identify the churches in the diocese who have the largest carbon footprint so that resources that can be prioritised where they can have the most impact. This will be done by completing the Church in Wales Energy Footprint Tool which is a simple online survey. We are mindful that we don't want to create extra work for any of our clergy or volunteers so we are completing as much of this form as we can on behalf of our churches.

Through discussions with Ministry Area Leaders, we have a list of the churches that we think have a high energy footprint, based on their size and how often they are used. We would like to start completing the Energy Footprint Tool for these churches. Although we can do the majority of the work, we might be contacting treasurers to ask for some information about energy bills. This will involve asking for a copy of your latest bill and some brief information around your tariff.

Although we are prioritising our largest churches for now, all our churches can complete the Energy Footprint Tool. You might be interested to discover the carbon footprint of your church!

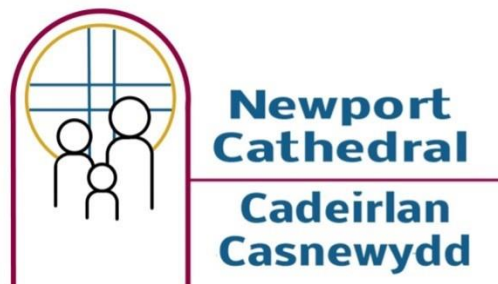

## New Church Community Hubs



You are likely to have already heard something about our diocesan evangelism project but, now that funding is secured, we want to share with you some details so that you have a better understanding of what is planned. This is an exciting project for the whole diocese, and we hope that you will all share in that excitement as we bring more people to faith and look to welcome new worshippers to the diocesan family.

Monmouth Diocese is planting four new church communities, aimed primarily at bringing under-40s to faith. The first two will be launched this year in Chepstow and Tredegar, with the remaining two following in 2026 (locations to be decided). The churches will be focused on sharing the gospel message with the community and creating a 'family' within the church for everyone to belong to – including lots of under 40s.

The landmark £3m project was announced at the start of the year and young people and families will be the focus. The funding comes from the Church in Wales' Evangelism Fund, set up six years ago for diocesan projects to help people engage with the Christian faith in new and exciting ways.

Work on the project has already begun and we are looking for a great team to establish these new worshipping communities, drawing children and families into faith and discipleship.
