Governing Body of Church In Wales



Delegates from across Wales are in Newport this week attending the Governing Body of the Church in Wales.

One of the key agenda items of the two-day meeting is the pollution of our rivers and the Archbishop of Wales called for a halt to the "indefensible abuse" of our waterways, during his opening address. Rivers, he said, were dying because of pollution.

It was the role of the Church to speak out on issues of fairness and justice, he said.

"As we serve those around us, we do so as Christians. We are not an NGO nor an arm of government. We are compelled to speak out on issues where we believe something is out of place."

Archbishop Andrew's keynote address also looked at how the Church in Wales could grow and thrive in an uncertain landscape.

The Governing Body is meeting at the International Convention Centre Wales today (April 17) and tomorrow (April 18) and is live-streamed via a link on the Church in Wales website and YouTube channel

Vocations Sunday - 21st April




Vocation is the place where the world's greatest need and a person's greatest joy meet." — Frederick Buechner

For some, this is a specific calling to ministry. For others, it could mean serving God through faithful discipleship in everyday life.







Churches Count on Nature 2024



The biodiversity survey, supported by environmental charities A Rocha UK and Caring for God's Acre, as well as The Church of England and The Church in Wales, will take place from 8-16 June 2024 (same as Great Big Green Week).

It is open to all denominations and A Rocha UK are especially keen to see more participation beyond the Church in Wales this year. There were 36 events last year in Wales and it would be great if that increased this year.

You could hold an event in your churchyard/ burial ground/ church land as part of GBGW, where you invite local people in to look for and record different species of plants, birds, insects etc. The scheme is in its fourth year and we would love to see more chapels and churches across Wales participate.

You will then be sent a pack that will help with identifying species (Welsh language versions are available too).

It is a fantastic way to involve children and young people (maybe the local school or uniformed groups) as they always love a bug hunt! There will be a page on the 'Stories' section of the **Eco Church website** soon from churches that took part in CCoN last year to inspire you too.

It is a great opportunity to put on an event, activity or make an announcement and take advantage of being part of a nationwide campaign. As the name suggests, it is all about doing something 'green' and drawing people in (including new people from your community) to celebrate environmentally friendly activities while raising awareness of the urgent need for climate action by us all.

New Church Community Hubs



You are likely to have already heard something about our diocesan evangelism project but, now that funding is secured, we want to share with you some details so that you have a better understanding of what is planned. This is an exciting project for the whole diocese, and we hope that you will all share in that excitement as we bring more people to faith and look to welcome new worshippers to the diocesan family.

Monmouth Diocese is planting four new church communities, aimed primarily at bringing under-40s to faith. The first two will be launched this year in Chepstow and Tredegar, with the remaining two following in 2026 (locations to be decided). The churches will be focused on sharing the gospel message with the community and creating a 'family' within the church for everyone to belong to – including lots of under 40s.

The landmark £3m project was announced at the start of the year and young people and families will be the focus. The funding comes from the Church in Wales' Evangelism Fund, set up six years ago for diocesan projects to help people engage with the Christian faith in new and exciting ways.

Work on the project has already begun and we are looking for a great team to establish these new worshipping communities, drawing children and families into faith and discipleship.
