Usk Show 2022 Chaplaincy Tent





An account from Clare Bradley

Once again 10th September 2022 saw Usk Show come to life, and with it our Chaplaincy Tent which we have run since 2017.

With the tent kindly provided free of charge by Monnow Marquees, tables, chairs and mugs collected from St Mary's Usk and most of the other paraphernalia brought from Raglan our tent started to come to life on the Friday evening. Then from 8.00am on show day it sprang to life.

We aim to provide free tea, coffee, squash and biscuits for anyone who wants them, together with somewhere to rest, and baby changing facilities in a horsebox beside the tent kindly supplied by Rev'd Lea Ryder and her husband Miles Kennah. We have a rota of people to man the tent, including clergy, particularly if anyone needs special conversations, servers, washers up, and optional play for children. The Archdeacon, Ven. Ian Rees proved to be an expert in washing up. Bishop Cherry also came and spent some time with us.

It is impossible to say just how many people passed through our space but suffice it to say that we got through well over 100 teabags and almost 12 pints of milk, together with about 150 small packs of biscuits!

Towards the end of the day, we were all astounded to be given a card saying that we had won First in the Best Small Non-Agricultural Trade Stand category as we had no knowledge of such a category, nor that we might be considered, nor when we were judged, although someone thought that a visit we received from the Mayor of Usk might have something to do with it.

Although everything is provided free of charge, many visitors feel they want to give us some money, and we always choose a charity to receive these donations. This year we chose Shelterbox and the money collected on the day amounted to £238.92. Some people are still choosing to make donations so we will wait a few days before sending the money off.

A huge 'Thank you' to everyone who helped in any way. We will no doubt be back next year.

Module A: Safeguarding Awareness

It is an opportunity for people to reflect on their role within the church and to understand what their individual responsibility is within the wider context of safeguarding in the church. It is a requirement that all clergy and anyone who has a role which involves working with children, young people and adults at risk complete this safeguarding training to equip and support them in their work.

The next series of Gofal ein Gwinllan, a series discussing the contribution of the Church in Wales to the language, history and culture of Wales, will start on the **28 September.**


