2022 Diocesan Conference











Our Diocesan Conference this year was full of hope, joy, energy and excitement – and certainly showed our commitment to 'Faith in our Future'!

With the launch of a new vision for the diocese, the announcement of additional funding from the Representative Body and the ability to all come together in person, there was certainly a 'buzz' and a feeling of positivity.

But, as Bishop Cherry reminded us in her presidential address - "we have a job

to do!"

Speaking about emerging from the pandemic, Bishop Cherry, said: ".... let's not either slide back into some sort of comfort blanket, content to feel safe and secure in our old familiar ways. Because we have a job to do.

"....we don't have to look far to see the challenges we face as we emerge from the pandemic. If we're honest with ourselves (and honest we have to be), the challenges were there even before the pandemic. But we see them now all the more clearly."

She highlighted three main challenges – declining number of people attending our acts of worship; implications for our church buildings and cost of living crisis.

However, she added: "there's hope and joy, there's energy and even excitement, because we continue to believe that God holds out before us a hopeful future. As our headline vision statement proclaims, we have faith in our future.

"And this isn't just an empty rallying cry devoid of any substance. There are good reasons to be hopeful and joyful...."

Bishop Cherry shared the news that the Representative Body had agreed additional funding for the Diocese of Monmouth for £6.7m over the next 10 years to enable us to build and grow. It's not a 'magic wand' but shows 'an extraordinary vote of confidence is us as a diocese and in our potential.'

BEIS Survey

BEIS in UK Government are holding a survey collecting evidence of the needs of non-domestic customers – including churches and chapels – for further assistance with energy bills after March 2023, when the current assistance scheme ends. The survey must be completed by the **end of Monday October 24**.

Because of the survey format, Cytûn cannot reply on behalf of all our members collectively as it asks for details of the energy bills of individual organisations, to which we do not have access. I realise that this will also be true of most denominational offices, but we strongly advise you to reply to this survey with as much information as you have and explain further in boxes 2.10 and 3.2. Cytûn will do the same.

You may wish to send the survey to local churches, or a sample of them, asking them to respond directly to the survey. The more responses are received from churches and chapels, the stronger will be the evidence base in our favour. We are grateful to Faith Action for supplying the answers to questions 1.2, 1.3 and 1.4 – see below.

The survey is designed for a wide range of organisations, but the following is useful for VCFSE sector organisations to be clear on:

Safeguarding Training Dates

Module A: Safeguarding Awareness

The Church in Wales Safeguarding Awareness Course is aimed at everyone within our church communities, and is intended to equip you to help make the church – and keep the church – a safe place.

It is a requirement that all clergy and anyone who has a role which involves working with children, young people and adults at risk complete this safeguarding training to equip and support them in their work.





Red Lines and Resilience - 15th November

Newport Cathedral are delighted that Peter Leonard, who was until recently the Archdeacon of the Isle of Wight, and prior to this Canon Chancellor at Portsmouth Cathedral, will be leading an evening on Red Lines and Resilience on **Tuesday 15th November** at 7: 30 p.m. (*note change of date*) in the Cathedral.

Peter is the Chief Executive of Family Links - The Centre for Emotional Health.

Newport Rugby - Newport Cathedral Remembrance Lecture

On Thursday 17th November at 7.30 pm, historian Peter Jones will be giving a lecture on the remarkable life of Charlie Pritchard at Newport Cathedral. Charlie was one of the very early giants of Newport Rugby and was a member of the Wales team who beat the New Zealand All Blacks in 1905. Charlie was on of thirteen Wales Internationals to be killed in the first world war. Please do come and learn about his remarkable life. On display will be the shirt that Charlie

wore in that famous 1905 victory and other memorabilia. Copies of Peter's biography of Charlie will be available in the Cathedral Shop.

Housing Justice Cymru will be holding an online event on 27th October from 6.30pm to 8.30pm to raise awareness of the issues faced by refugees seeking sanctuary in Wales (please see attached flyer above).

Housing Justice Cymru feel that is important that our communities understand why people flee their homes and come to Wales, and also understand the challenges they are faced with after arriving. They will discuss issues of destitution, homelessness, and exploitation, as well as explaining the difficulties presented by asylum law and policy.

There will be an opportunity for attendees to 'Discover the World of Hosting' and ask questions. There will also be guest speakers who are happy to discuss their experiences of hosting (some of whom are current hosts and some of whom have been helped by hosts during their asylum journey).

By partnering with EYST for this event, we will explain the history of hosting in Wales, how people can register to become hosts, and how Housing Justice supports hosts.
