Safeguarding Sunday - 6th November



This weekend, the Diocese of Monmouth will be marking Safeguarding Sunday (November 6).

It is a special day in the calendar when we are reminded of our commitment to being a safe church and that we all have a part to play in nurturing the wellbeing of all.

Safeguarding 'needs to be embedded in all aspects of the life and ministry of the Church" and safeguarding training is key to achieving this.

The training is relevant, informative and practical and helps equip anyone who is committed to making their churches safe and welcoming for all.

Church in Wales Food and Fuel Campaign

People suffering the 'devastating' impact of the cost of living crisis will be helped by a campaign launched by the Church in Wales last Wednesday.

The Food and Fuel campaign addresses the causes of food and fuel poverty by putting pressure on the Government to address the spiraling costs which is forcing families to choose between heating or eating.

Announcing the launch of Food and Fuel campaign, The Archbishop of Wales Andrew John said, "Our churches are witnessing first-hand the devastating impact of the cost-of-living crisis in Wales' communities. With more and more people struggling to make ends meet, the collective voice of the Church in Wales is best placed to advocate on their behalf."

The Archbishop is calling on all churches to join the Food and Fuel campaign, "As Christians we are a called to speak out against poverty. Our mission in

Wales is to live out the gospel message of hope, justice and love."

A Gift for Christmas

Unique Commemoration of Two Queens



Over four hundred years ago the people who then lived in Llantrisant near Usk built a tower onto their church. To mark this, one of them carved an inscription to the then Queen Elizabeth into a stone high up on a gable wall:

1593 ER XXXV

This week a matching hand carved stone plaque commemorating the long reign of Queen Elizabeth II was affixed to the same wall:

2020 EIIR LXX

The new plaque was blessed and dedicated this past Sunday 30th October at 3pm in the presence of the High Sheriff of Gwent.

Module A: Safeguarding Awareness

The Church in Wales Safeguarding Awareness Course is aimed at everyone within our church communities, and is intended to equip you to help make the church – and keep the church – a safe place.

Module B: Understanding Safeguarding and the Church

This module is a closer look at safeguarding in the church context and applies it to the ministry, mission or service that our clergy, laity and volunteers undertake. It is an opportunity for people to reflect on their role within the church and to understand what their individual responsibility is within the wider context of safeguarding in the church. It is a requirement that all clergy and anyone who has a role which involves working with children, young people and adults at risk complete this safeguarding training to equip and support them in their work.


