Maundy Money

Two members of our diocese had the special honour of receiving Maundy Money from HRH King Charles during a service at York Minster.



Paulette Brown and Rod Davies attended the Royal Maundy Service where they were presented with two purses: a red purse containing two commemorative coins, symbolising the Sovereign's historic gift of food and clothing (this year, one will celebrate His Majesty's forthcoming 75th birthday and the other will commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Windrush Generation) and a white purse containing a set of specially minted silver Maundy coins, equivalent in value to the age of the Monarch (this year is 74p).

During the service, His Majesty presented 74 men and 74 women with the Maundy Money to thank them for their outstanding Christian service and for making a difference to the lives of people in their local communities. The service dates back to 600AD and these special coins have kept much the same form since 1670. The first recorded Royal Distribution was at Knaresborough, North Yorkshire by King John in 1210.

Paulette said, "It was a great and unexpected honour to be nominated to receive the Maundy Money from King Charles in the glorious setting of York Minster. Great pageantry, wonderful music, beautiful readings - an awesome occasion but the theme of humble service was never lost."

She went on to describe the day: "So many things will stay in my memory - the tapping sticks of the Yeoman of the Guard in stately procession, the majesty of Zadok the Priest and the resounding rendition of Love Divine to the Welsh tune, Blaenwern.

Rod described it as 'a truly unforgettable day!'

"What would I be doing receiving a letter from the Royal Almonary Office of Buckingham Palace in January this year? Total surprise! The letter was an invitation to receive Maundy Money from His Majesty the King on 6th April at York Minster.

"I was truly honoured to be considered for such an occasion and thrilled at the prospect of attending such a special service. Of course this is the first time the


will have carried out this service in his own right. 74men and 74 women received the gift, 74 being the age of the monarch."

Rod was allowed one companion on the special day, and he took his son John.

Speaking about the day, Rod said: "York Minster is a breathtaking building! It is enormous and awe-inspiring. On the morning of the service the nave was full with some 1500 people in attendance including the Maundy Money recipients, their companions and those invited from the local community, diocese and wider area. The pageantry and organisation was superb, to the usual high standards for national events of this sort. The service started a few minutes after 11 am and finished at 12pm.

"The actual presentation of the Maundy Money was completed with equal efficiency. In my case the King was directed towards me, he said some words of gratitude and handed me the 2 purses each containing the Maundy Money.

"The whole event form start to finish was a humbling and unforgettable experience for me. The gift is symbolic and resonates with Jesus washing the feet of His disciples."



Archbishop makes climate plea in key speech



The Archbishop of Wales called for an active response to the climate emergency, in his key note address at Governing Body today (19th April).

Delivering his Presidential Address to members of the Church in Wales' Governing Body at the start of its two-

day meeting in Llandudno, the Archbishop announced that the Church would hold an Environmental Summit next year to bring together key stakeholders with the aim of making Wales "an exemplar of good practice."

Safeguarding Training Dates

Safeguarding Courses will be available across the diocese in 2023 to ensure that everyone has the right level of up to date training for their role and has a good understanding of their role in safeguarding in the church.

Module A is available online and can be undertaken independently without a trainer and without booking. The course is designed to support all of us within our church communities and aims to equip everyone to help make the church – and keep the church – a safe place. It should be completed by all clergy, everyone with a church office and anyone requiring further safeguarding training. Widows, mothers and virgins: praying with women through hard times with Rev Dr Hannah Lewis SCL

Hannah writes, "There is a perception that to pray we need to be able to spend time in formal prayer and contemplation. However, for many people, the reality is different as busy lives balancing work and family, stress, grief, and other things get in the way. This day doesn't claim to have all the answers but will reflect on the stories of some obvious and not so obvious women of prayer from the Bible and in history to assist us to recognise and celebrate where we are already people of prayer and to encourage us to keep on keeping on."

Hannah Lewis is a BSL using deaf priest currently working in the Diocese of Oxford with the deaf community. She is also a liberation theologian and a single mother and has taken life vows in a Single Consecrated Life. Prayer is the only way she holds all this together.

This day includes inputs from Hannah, a Eucharist at noon and Evening Prayer at 4.00pm – and the option to join the community earlier and attend Morning Prayer at 9.30am. The talks and services will have a BSL interpreter. Participants are asked to bring their own lunch; hot drinks will be provided.


