We are really excited that some of our churches are taking part in the Churches Unlocked Festival.

The event runs from Saturday 3rd to Sunday 11th June and gives churches the chance to celebrate their history, heritage and the lively communities which use them today.

Ten of our churches will be featured, as a pilot for the scheme which was launched by neighbouring Llandaff Diocese last year, and it would be great if everyone could come along and support them!

Archdeacon of Monmouth, Ian Rees, said, "Having heard about the success of the first Churches Unlocked in 2022 and having visited one of the open churches myself, it is wonderful for Monmouth Diocese to be involved this year. Our church buildings represent a massive treasure, but they are too often closed, other than for services or occasional other events.

"As we increasingly focus on being outward looking in mission, we also have an opportunity to extend an invitation for people to come and look around our buildings, and to become inspired by the history as well as the generations that have worshipped in those buildings before us. But it's also an opportunity to show how we our telling the Christian story today and our buildings are important tools in doing that. I have no doubt that Churches Unlocked will be a success for those taking part from Monmouth Diocese and we look forward to it growing in years to come."

New tool helps churches measure carbon footprint



Churches are able to measure their carbon footprint thanks to a new online too which was launched at the recent Governing Body meeting.

The Energy Footprint Tool is a quick and easy way for churches to find out how much carbon they use each year, helping them plan action to reduce and offset it.

Clerics and volunteers can now input data from their annual energy bills and the tool instantly calculates the carbon footprint of their church. With such baseline information, plans can be made locally to encourage mitigation measures for each church in context, while high energy users can be identified and targeted for further help.

Julia Edwards, Climate Champion for the Church in Wales, says: "The Energy Footprint Tool is one of the tools that we have developed to monitor our progress towards Net Zero by 2030. It is easy to use, and not only will you get an instant carbon calculation when you enter last year's energy bills for your church, the tool will also help us to identify and target our collective actions towards high energy-use buildings.

"We encourage you to use the EFT, therefore, to calculate your carbon baseline because then you will know whether your church emits high or low levels of carbon, and we will fully understand which of our buildings we need to focus our attention on to achieve the greatest carbon savings."

Hannah writes, "There is a perception that to pray we need to be able to spend time in formal prayer and contemplation. However, for many people, the reality is different as busy lives balancing work and family, stress, grief, and other things get in the way. This day doesn't claim to have all the answers but will reflect on the stories of some obvious and not so obvious women of prayer from the Bible and in history to assist us to recognise and celebrate where we are already people of prayer and to encourage us to keep on keeping on."

Hannah Lewis is a BSL using deaf priest currently working in the Diocese of Oxford with the deaf community. She is also a liberation theologian and a single mother and has taken life vows in a Single Consecrated Life. Prayer is the only way she holds all this together.

This day includes inputs from Hannah, a Eucharist at noon and Evening Prayer at 4.00pm – and the option to join the community earlier and attend Morning Prayer at 9.30am. The talks and services will have a BSL interpreter. Participants are asked to bring their own lunch; hot drinks will be provided.



Safeguarding Training Dates

Safeguarding Courses will be available across the Diocese in 2023 to ensure that everyone has the right level of up to date training for their role and has a good understanding of their role in Safeguarding in the Church.

Module A is available online and can be undertaken independently without a trainer and without booking. The course is designed to support all of us within our church communities and aims to equip everyone to help make the church – and keep the church – a safe place. It should be completed by all clergy,

Anna Chaplaincy Training



With a rapidly ageing population, Older People's Ministry has never been more important.

Anna Chaplaincy (which is being pioneered through the Bible Reading Fellowship) has responded to this need developing a model of Older People's Ministry in the community.

In their role, Anna Chaplains promote the spiritual welfare of older people in the wider community, particularly those facing challenges living independently; and offer spiritual support to older people who are living in care homes and sheltered housing complexes, their relatives and staff who look after them.

Rev Sally Rees, Anna Chaplaincy Lead for Wales is leading an Anna Chaplaincy Training course online in the coming months.

The training is held over six weeks with one 2 hour Zoom session per week with around 2 hours reading, preparation and reflection between sessions.

The course involves teaching and discussion in break out rooms and also has input from other Anna Chaplains in Wales who share experiences of their role and some case study work.

The course costs £90 (Included in the cost is the Anna Chaplaincy Handbook - £25 if bought separately) the training manual (course material and resources) and the 6 sessions.

The course does not make you an Anna Chaplain but will help you explore if this is for you. There is no assignment but there is a request to write a report or reflection for your church/ ministry area (whichever is appropriate). Everyone who completes the course receives a certificate of attendance with details of the course shown.

If you have a heart to serve older people in your community and would like to explore whether this is a ministry for you – this course is designed to help you discern this calling.

National Churches Trust Grants Programme



The National Churches Trust Small Grants programme (previously Cornerstone) makes grants of up to £5,000 towards urgent maintenance works and small repairs identified as high priority within a recent Quinquennial Inspection or Survey Report, as well as small investigative works and surveys. Project costs should not exceed £20,000 including VAT. For more information, click here.

Their Medium grants programme offers grants of between £3,000 and £10,000towards urgent and essential maintenance and repair projects costing between£20,000 and £80,000 and project development and investigative work up to RIBA planning stage 1 to support churches preparing for a major project, and in developing their project to the point at which they can approach a major grant funder. For more information, click here.

Their Large Grants programme offers grants of up to £50,000 towards the cost of major urgent structural repair projects costed at more than £80,000including VAT and projects that introduce kitchens and accessible toilets to enable increased community use, costed at more than £30,000 including VAT. Grants will never exceed 50% of the project cost. For more information, click here.

Awards will never exceed 50% of the costs. Although some deadlines are imminent, they have a constant cycle of funding opportunities so make yourself aware of their requirements as you plan your works.
