

## Thoughts from a Parishioner

"We had just completed our 9 days of MA Mission and Prayer. Various creative ways had challenged and enabled us to support each other in reaching out to our local communities. Now we needed to come together again to somehow come up with a new Vision Statement that clearly united us in who we are in Christ, to reach out to serve our diverse communities in our different locations.

As we gathered, we were initially invited to sit in our church groups. All well and good as this gently eased us into the well thought out process for the day, that was very knowledgably and encouragingly led by our two gracious, sensitive and friendly Archdeacons Stella Bailey and Ian Rees.

Each church was given a reel of stickers of a particular colour and invited to place a sticker alongside each action our church had written on the previously compiled common headed lists. This proved such an excellent exercise, encouraging and thought provoking, as we began to see clearly and colourfully the unity already in our

church activities, besides space for different actions happening dependent on the community. Conversations and questions began in and across the groups. Could some of the activities not included on our list be considered in our area? We were learning from each other. Impressively, a good pace was kept whilst nothing was rushed.



Relaxed, having enjoyed our lunch break and by now in thinking mode, we were invited to move from the safety of our groups to join a different group.... of purely parishioners!! No longer any clergy to help as they were in a group of their own! The time for the "biggy" had arrived and each group was now flying solo.

Taking on board all we'd learnt from the morning, we needed to sum up all that we do and why for our different locations and communities into ONE sentence!! Argh! Could it be done? Could we do it?

It seemed our confident and competent leaders believed in each of us!

Displayed to help us were five words that had arisen from our morning discussions.

Could and would they be used in our constructive thinking?

We certainly got to know each other very quickly as each group grappled with words, trying to come up with one or more coherent sentences to be displayed and considered as a united group.

Under pressure with sentences displayed, we were carefully and graciously guided to consider our efforts. Amazingly one sentence began to emerge as the best. Very quickly with a little tweaking and united in agreement that it covered all bases......we had our ministry area VISION STATEMENT! And achieved in less time than anticipated.

Finally, what could be better to end a most enjoyable, thought provoking and successful day than to gather together in praise and worship with Holy Communion to give thanks to God through Jesus for the gentle guidance of The Holy Spirit.....Answered prayer.... I loved it! And I don't think I was alone."

### **Srebrenica Memorial Week**

Remembering Srebrenica is a charitable organisation whose aim is to commemorate the Bosnian genocide. Their aim is to bring people together from different backgrounds to tackle hatred and help build safer, stronger, and more cohesive communities here in the UK.

This year's Srebrenica Memorial Week will be taking place from **4th July - 11th July**, and their 2023 theme is *'Together We Are One'*. The aim of the theme will be to highlight the fact that the conditions for genocide are built on a climate and culture which allows hatred and extremism to breed, resulting in the dividing and fracturing of communities.

Faith commemorations play a significant role in the efforts to help strengthen and bring communities together. The Diocese of Monmouth has been invited to join with thousands of memorial events and activities taking place, by holding an act of commemoration. Some suggestions for your participation are to:

- Hold a special service on Sunday 9th July. There are template programmes containing prayers, stories and readings that can easily be adapted to the service, found <a href="here">here</a>.
