

#### 'Give Away' Market

St Hilda's and St Oswald's Churches, in Mid Torfaen Ministry Area, held a plant, fruit and vegetable 'Give Away' Market on Saturday 19th August. This was the first of this new initiative. The markets give an opportunity for the community to come together and donate excess produce from their allotments or gardens, or fruit from foraging in the countryside. The produce collected is then displayed on market stalls and members of the community who attend are given a carrier bag and can then view the selection of plants, fruit and veg available and they can then fill up their carrier bags free of charge.



The churches were delighted with how much produce people donated from the surplus supplies from their gardens and allotments. The key to the success of the market is down to the fact that everything was donated and all the produce was free of charge!

There was a wide range of plants, fruit and vegetables available and people who attended could socialise over tea and coffee, cake and biscuits (again provided free of charge). The market provides a great opportunity for members of the community to catch up with each other and share some fellowship.

Like last year, several people went foraging and picked some blackberries which were complemented by some cooking apples. Several people made

pies and crumbles, again which were given away at no charge. They also were able to distribute some preserves of jam, chutney and pickles.

Although this was a free market, some people gave monetary donations and this will be used to buy supplies for our local foodbanks and shares across the Eastern Valley.

The churches are planning a second market which will include fruit and vegetables as well as preserved chutneys, jams and pickles, it is scheduled to be held on the **23rd September 2023** in St Oswald's, again opening at 10am until either 1pm or when everything has gone!

**Family Fun Afternoon** 

St Cadoc's Church, Caerleon, had an amazing Family Fun afternoon at the weekend. The church was buzzing with over 100 visitors coming through the doors to enjoy the activities and delicious cakes, many of them new to church.



It was a wonderful afternoon of community engagement to raise funds for the Refurbishment Appeal at St. Cadoc's. Over £650 was raised!

St Cadoc's has ambitious plans for the development of the church building, which includes the removal of pews (to be replaced with chairs) thus creating a flexible worship and community space.

Sharing these plans with the community also formed part of the Open Day, with the opportunity to 'Grab A Pew'. As they strive to be an eco church by reducing their carbon footprint, ASHP and PV's will be installed with underfloor heating.

**Energy Bill Support** 

We are aware that many churches have received energy bills that have increased dramatically over the past few months. Some of these have been exceptionally higher, further increasing the pressure on ministry area budgets.

The DBF set aside a support fund for ministry areas in this situation to offer financial assistance towards some of the increases incurred.

You may be eligible for this support, if you have:

- a winter energy bill that has increased significantly in comparison to the previous year and,
- the energy bills have made a significant impact to your finances, including reserves, resulting in the ministry area being unable to meet other costs.

If you need this support, we ask that ministry areas get in touch by email, detailing the situation and include the following information -

- Copies of the relevant bills
- Details of previous bills to demonstrate a significant rise,
- Details of how it has impacted the MA finances
- Any other relevant supporting information


