Church to Host All-Wales Climate Summit



The health of Wales' waterways and landscape will be the focus of an all-Wales climate summit hosted by the Church in Wales next year.

The two-day event will bring together academics, activists, pressure groups and stakeholders to discuss the impact of industry, agriculture and homes on the environment. The summit was announced by the Archbishop of Wales, Andrew John, in his Presidential address to members of the Church's Governing Body at the start of its two-day meeting yesterday (September 5).

Wales, he said, had "the opportunity to redesign our approach to energy, water, land use and the sustainability of food supply and at a local level" and the Church on Wales was well placed to bring people together in "good conversation and partnership".

Archbishop Andrew said plans were in progress for "an intelligent and honest conversation about one of the great challenges we face". He said the event would allow key people to listen to one another and "find not only a common language but agree broad principles that allow policy and direction to emerge."

It was the Church's role, he said, to bring people together: "We have seen that church must mean much more than prayers and gathering on Sunday, that our commitment to justice, to the creation, to the poor might take us into uncomfortable places..... We are not the experts save we know what good signposting looks like and what human flourishing involves. Our ability to bring people together in good conversation and partnership should never be underestimated." The summit will take place in the second half of 2024. More details will be published nearer the time.

Governing Body Motion

During its meeting this week, members of the Governing Body approved a motion to allow Ministry Area Councils to form Charitable Incorporated Organisations, following consultation with their Archdeacon. Further guidance on the procedure to do this will be released shortly.

The Revd Kevin Hasler, Ministry Area Leader of the Heart of Monmouthshire MA, has announced his intention to resign from the post on 26th November, the Feast of Christ the King. He has served as Area Dean and on a number of diocesan and national committees including the DBF, Standing Committee and the Governing Body. Kevin has a pastoral heart and a deep and abiding faith that has shaped the whole of his ministry and I am genuinely pleased that the diocese will continue to benefit from what he has to offer in the coming years, albeit in a different form.'



Licensing of New Ministry Area Leader

Congratulations to Fr Ross who was licensed as Ministry Area Leader of The Mountain and Marsh Ministry Area on Sunday.

Ross moved back to the diocese from Winchester College in September 2022, having served his curacy here, to be Vicar in the ministry area and was appointed Ministry Area Leader earlier in the year.



Passionate about the role of the Church in the secular world, Ross currently serves as a Reservist Chaplain within the Royal Navy and as a Branch Chaplain to the Royal British Legion.

At the time of his appointment Ross said, "there is a great deal of potential in the newly formed Mountain and Marsh Ministry Area, and it has been such a joy to witness the beginnings of growth and renewal in many of the churches. Stephanie, Saoirse, and I are looking forward to this next step on a journey that we couldn't have written for ourselves. Weare deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve, and we look forward to joining you all, embracing the challenges and trusting in Jesus who beckons us towards a future brimming with promise and purpose."

Later this year Ross will publish a study in Mariology. The book includes original research, as well as responses from theologians, notably the Rt Revd Gregory Cameron, the Bishop of St Asaph.

Ross is married to Stephanie, and last year welcomed daughter, Saoirse. They also share the house with three cats: Wilfred, Hermione and Esme. The family enjoy holidays in their campervan, 'Bilbo'.

Chaplaincy at the Usk Show 9th September 2023



Homelessness Sunday - 8th October 2023

The number of people experiencing homelessness around the UK has rising sharply since the pandemic. This year's Homelessness Sunday will be an excellent opportunity to raise awareness of the plight of so many who have become marginalised in our society, and to reflect on what we as churches and communities can do to help alleviate a very serious problem on our doorstep.

'Love and Justice' is the theme for Homelessness Sunday, as this is a core value of Christian charity Housing Justice's mission to alleviate homelessness across Wales. Housing Justice provides a range of resources for churches wishing to run their own Homelessness Sunday service including prerecorded sermons, prayers, hymn suggestions, Junior Church resources, and information about homelessness via this <u>dedicated webpage</u>.

The charity, which has expanded dramatically and now employs a team of 13 across Wales, numbers former Archbishop of Wales, Bishop John Davies, among its Board of Trustees.

Housing Justice runs various initiatives that address housing need including a hosting programme for destitute asylum seekers; a homelessness prevention programme called 'Citadel'; and the Faith in Affordable Housing programme which addresses the housing shortage.





CMD in December - for Clergy and LLMs

The next Continuing Ministerial Development day for all Clergy and LLMs will be on **Tuesday 5th December** at **Christchurch Hall** (Caerleon, NP18 1JJ).



We're thrilled that Revd Dr Jordan Hillebert is leading this day, with the theme of **A Theology of Prayer and a Prayerful Ministry**.

Jordan Hillebert was born and raised in the States, completed a PhD in Scotland (University of St Andrews), and is currently Director of Formation and Tutor of Theology at St Padarn's Institute, where he oversees the training and formation of candidates for ministry in the Church in Wales.

He teaches and writes in the areas of Christian theology, ethics, and spirituality.

In this session, we will devote ourselves to a theology of prayer with the aim of developing a more prayerful ministry. In particular, we will explore the account of prayer provided by Saint John of Damascus: *'Prayer is an ascent of the mind to God or a petition for suitable things from God.'* In both senses (as contemplative and petitionary), prayer is essential to the life of Christian ministry, attuning us to God's presence and enabling us to participate in God's work.


