Bishops call for peace in Israel and Gaza



The Church in Wales bishops are calling for peace and reconciliation in Israel and Gaza.

In a joint statement issued on 31st October, the bishops, including the Archbishop of Wales, warn that violence will not lead to lasting peace and they call for the "active exercise of compassion" for all Palestinian and Jewish people.

They describe Hamas' attack on Israel on October 7 as "morally repugnant" and unjustifiable and call for Israel to recognise that "retribution, violence, and innocent suffering" cannot lead to peace. They also urge a pause in the attacks on Gaza for humanitarian aid to get through.

The bishops ask people to take part in a day of fasting and prayer on Friday (November 3) and for special prayers to be said in churches on Sunday.

Funding for conservation project



The church in Lower Machen has received £149,000 in lottery funding to conserve its 15th-century belltower.

The money was awarded to St Michael and All Angels Church by the National Lottery Heritage Fund and will certainly help towards the full cost of the quarter of a millionpound project.

Revd Ross Maidment, Ministry Area Leader, said: "We're incredibly grateful that the National Lottery Heritage Fund is able to support this project which will not only ensure that we're able to preserve St Michael's Church for future generations, but will also enable us to continue to serve the community of Lower Machen as we seek to make Jesus known.

"We are excited by the possibilities to further connect with schools through our heritage project, and the wider community through the plans we have to develop a wildlife conservation project within the grounds."

The belltower project will see the continuing development of the Grade II* listed church as a Heritage and Learning Centre. The project will also allow the church to expand its relationship with local schools to share knowledge of the 900-year development of Machen and local communities, with a special interest in growth during the Industrial Age.

Working in partnership with Caerphilly Woodlands Trust, the church will use the funding for nature-based activities aimed at increasing knowledge of plants and wildlife in the churchyard. This eco-project will encourage well-being within the community and help protect the natural environment.

Churchwarden Wayne Barnett, said: "The church can now carry out essential repairs and conservation works to the belltower. The lead roof is in poor condition allowing rain in, and the deterioration of the 500-year-old stone work and pointing is causing increased problems.

"National Lottery Heritage Fund Grant Funding is only possible because of money raised from National Lottery players, and our thanks go to all those millions of people who have helped secure the church's future and ensure it remains at the heart of the community."

The repair work on the church will start on the 7th November and is expected to last three to five months depending on weather conditions.

Retirement

The Revd Julian White, Vicar in the Severn Wye Ministry Area, is retiring on Sunday November 5th after 44 years of ordained ministry in the Diocese of Monmouth.

Julian was ordained deacon in 1979. He served his curacy at St Mark's, Newport and a first incumbency in what was the Rectorial Benefice of Llanmartin. He then went to be Rector of Llandogo with Whitebrook and Tintern before moving to Mathern, Mounton and St Pierre in 1998 where he has remained.

Julian has been a faithful priest over the years. He is a man of prayer who enjoys the rich traditions of the Anglican Church. He has always been keen to live out the Christian faith and serve the communities as well as the churches in his care. He is well known and much loved in the villages he currently serves. In response to a question about his aspirations for ministry some time ago, he characteristically responded "to resist attempts to 'dumb down' the Christian faith."

Julian's wife, Sandra, has been a tremendous support both to him and to the churches he has served.

Both of them go with our thanks, our prayers and every good wish for a long and happy retirement.


