Friday Update from Bishop Cherry

Last week, I mentioned that we had sent some money to our link diocese, The Highveld, to support them as they tackle the impacts of the Coronavirus out there. The money came from the Lent Appeal in 2018 which we were going to add to whatever comes in for this year's Lent Appeal. But we thought that they needed at least something sooner rather than later. Many churches, I know, are busy helping with Foodbanks and seeking to support those in most need with essential food and toiletries. This is vital work and one of the few ways at the moment that we can show our care for the poor and those most in need. In a letter to the Archbishop, the Trussell Trust records its thanks and appreciation for the ways in which the church is supporting this work. However, they also raise some important points about tackling the injustice of poverty and deprivation that we need to hear. Very often, we are much better at helping the poor than striving to combat the unjust structures of our society that lead to poverty in the first place. The letter can be read here.

Meetings have started happening again and it is good to see how many are embracing the wonders of modern technology. It is strange meeting people for the first time via Zoom, but that is how it has to be for now.

The Equality and Diversity Group was one of those that I 'attended' this week and I was encouraged to learn about their work. Up until now, they have been looking at the representation of women at all levels of our church's life (following the Todd report that was brought to the Governing Body) and seeking to ensure that women make up a good proportion of the membership of our boards and committees, as well as our ordained and lay ministers. We are now looking at broadening out the agenda to look at how we become a more diverse church where everyone feels that the are welcome and respected for who they are.

I also met with the Spirituality Group that are doing such important work in the areas of prayer and spirituality; helping people to grow in their relationship with God and deepen their prayer life. This work is foundational for all of us if we are to be able to work with God in drawing people into faith and discipleship.

May has arrived and it is now three months since my Enthronement at the Cathedral. How time flies! I continue to thank God for leading me to serve here in the Diocese of Monmouth. Let us continue to pray for one another as we seek to discern where God is leading us and what God is asking of us in this strange time of isolation.
