Ministry Area Lay Ministry Commissioning Service

A team of lay worship leaders and pastoral assistants were commissioned in a special service held at St Cadoc's Church in Raglan. The group have completed the relevant training courses and are made up of those who have been involved in these ministries for some time and others who are new to this. The service was arranged and led by those who were commissioned.

In the address Archdeacon Ian reflected on lay ministry, saying, 'Whatever our call may be, as Christians we all have a calling - as you celebrate today those who have been commissioned, as you pray for their ministry going forward, pray and think also about whether God is inviting you to something different, something new...'

It was wonderful to see a full church coming together to celebrate God's gifts, and look forward to the gifts of those who were commissioned being used widely throughout the ministry area




Here are some thoughts from those that have recently completed the training courses.

Sarah Byford: 'I found both the Worship leaders' and Pastoral Visitors' courses very beneficial. Having been a pastoral visitor for a number of years, and having led Morning Prayer in my local church during the past two years, I

found that the pre-reading and the sessions on both courses gave me a deeper insight into these two areas of ministry to which I feel called.

One area of the Pastoral Visitors' course which involved practical interaction – that of listening- I found particularly helpful. I discovered that I am, perhaps, not as good a listener as I thought I was, and this is an important skill I need to develop further.

The Worship Leaders' course confirmed that there is so much more to leading worship than simply delivering a set traditional liturgy – and that introducing variety of services, with different styles and content is something I can do in the future, whist always ensuring a happy congregation who will come back for more, and bring their friends!'



The above prayer was used in the service and given out to all who attended.

Clare Bradley: 'Having been licensed as a Lay Eucharistic Minister on St David's Day 2010 and having done various other days training on Intercessions and Reading the Lesson, much of this course was familiar territory – although it never hurts to do a refresher. Being in front of a congregation and leading a service is something I am mostly comfortable with.

The part that I did enjoy and feel that I really got something out of was the idea that we are encouraged to adapt services, or even write our own for particular occasions. This authority to try to make our services especially relevant to our congregations and celebrations is really liberating and I look forward to trying to make use of it in the future.'

Deidre Seabourne: 'Although I have been leading services for the past two years, I had never attended or indeed received any formal training until this recent course was offered.

Therefore, it was helpful to know that I was leading in the way I should be and offering suggestions as to how I could improve things moving forward. It was also very helpful to meet with the other lay ministers to share concerns and indeed learn new or different ways of leading services.

I particularly like the weeks of Session 4 (Learning about Worship as a Mission) and Session 5 (Creating New Services) as I realised that you could change and/or adapt services and not just stick to the old ways.'

Time is Running Out to Apply for Grants!

Have you applied for a grant from the National Churches Trust for 2023 yet? If not, the deadlines for applications are fast approaching.

- * Medium-sized grants for £3,000 and £10,000, towards urgent and essential maintenance and repair projects costing between £20,000 and £80,000, have a deadline for applications of 11 December.
- * Cherish Grants for Wales are also available and have a deadline of 11 December.

Energy Bill Support Second Round: Closing Friday 17th November

We are aware that many churches have received energy bills that have increased dramatically over the past few months. Some of these have been considerably higher, further increasing the pressure on ministry area budgets. The DBF set aside a support fund for ministry areas in this situation to offer financial assistance towards some of the increases incurred and the first round of these funds were awarded in September.

We are now reopening the fund for a second round of applications. We are hoping this will assist ministry areas where fixed term contracts have recently ended, resulting in price rises.

You may be eligible for this support if -

- you have had an energy bill that has increased significantly in comparison to the previous year,
- energy bills have made a significant impact to your finances, including reserves, resulting in the ministry area being unable to meet other costs,
- you have not received grants towards energy bills from any other sources (e.g. LA 'Warm Hub' grants).

If you require support, we ask that ministry areas get in touch by email, detailing the situation and include the following information -

- Copies of the relevant bills
- Details of previous bills to demonstrate a significant rise,
- Details of how it has impacted the MA finances
- Any other relevant supporting information

Please note -

Applications can only be submitted by a ministry area, not individual churches. Ministry area applications should include all churches which have had an increase in bills and wish to apply for support.

Ministry areas who were awarded a grant in the first round of applications will not be considered for this round for the same churches, unless there have been further significant rises or changes in circumstance, but are welcome to apply for other churches in the area.

Top Tips for Diversifying Your Income

To successfully fundraise for your church, it's important to look at different approaches to income generation beyond the collection plate.

Ecclesiastical have hosted a webinar, in which you can learn:

- How partnering with other churches, charities, community groups can boost supporter audiences, economise on resource and amplify impact.
- Get creative examples of how to use church assets more commercially through event/space hire, food and beverage, etc, and what churches need to consider before embarking on commercial projects.
- How to think bigger than congregational collections, etc, so actually building major gifts strategies around specific campaigns and ongoing revenue needs, and what the ingredients for this look like.
