Pray for Peace this Christmas Joint message from Wales' Christian leaders

Christian leaders, representing churches and chapels across Wales, are joining together to invite people to pray for peace this Christmas.





The Anglican Archbishop of Wales, Andrew John, the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Cardiff and Bishop of Menevia, Mark O'Toole, and the Moderator of the Free Church Council of Wales, Simon Walkling, are issuing a joint message which acknowledges the tensions and tragedies in the world today and invites people to church to reflect and pray for peace.

They said, "We need peace in our world. We may want to be free of tension in our families. We may long for five minutes of peace for ourselves in all the Christmas preparations. Why not come to church to find space to reflect and make time to pray for peace this Christmas? We are praying for joy and hope for us all."

Announcement



For Your Prayers

Fr Jeremy Dowding

We were saddened to hear of the death of Fr Jeremy Dowding. Fr Jeremy was brought up at Holy Trinity, Abergavenny in the days when it was fairly 'high church'. He was a server, played the organ and served as Churchwarden there before heading off to train for the priesthood at St Stephen's House, Oxford. He returned to be curate of St Stephen's Newport and then St Mary's Risca before leaving the diocese for his incumbencies.

Retiring in 2019 and living in Crickhowell, Fr Jeremy served both this diocese and the diocese of Swansea and Brecon with PTO. He helped out in Abergavenny right up until just before he was diagnosed with Motor Neurone Disease. His ministry was greatly appreciated in the churches there. Before entering the ministry, Fr Jeremy was a psychiatric nurse at Pen-y-Fal Hospital in Abergavenny. Please do remember his wife Diane and sons Tom and Christopher in your prayers.

Revd Robert Prescott

We are also saddened to announce the death of Revd Robert Prescott SSC. Fr Robert served as curate of Abertillery from 1995 to 1999 and Vicar of Llanhileth from 1999 until his retirement in 2003. We give thanks for his ministry and pray for his family in their loss. His funeral will be at 2pm on Friday 5th January at St Paul's Church, Cwmtillery.


The two courses shown above are as follows:




Diocesan Grant Schemes

Standing Committee recently approved some changes to the diocesan building grants, to align with changes from the RB for the portion of the funds from them that we administer. We will now have a:

- Eco Grant up to £7,500 per church for work which improves carbon footprint/biodiversity/environmental impact of church building and churchyards, available to apply for every three years.
- **Churchyard Grant** up to £2,000 per church for works in a churchyard, available to apply for every three years.
- Large Building Grant up to £5,000 per church for works to a church or church hall, available to apply for every three years.
- Small Building Grant up to £1,000 per church for urgent and/or emergency works to a church, churchyard or church hall, available to apply for every year.

The G I Evans Memorial Trust

The Church in Wales is a bi-lingual church and here, in the Diocese of Monmouth, we are keen to play our part by encouraging our clergy and LLMs to learn some Welsh, even if it's only a few phrases.

The G I Evans Memorial Trust is a possible source of funding for Welsh language courses. This trust is available for clerics and ordinands to attend Welsh language courses at established educational institutions. (There is no specific list of 'established educational institutions' and this distinction is intended to ensure that proper teaching takes place – courses via universities or colleges or local providers would satisfy this requirement.)

The trust is administered by Natasha Aldridge (<u>natashaaldridge@churchinwales.org.uk</u>) in the legal department and the application form can be found <u>here</u>.

The trust is quite small with about £5,000 or so of funds available to spend each year. Larger grants can be sought via the Isla Johnston Trust, if applicants meet that trust's criteria.
