Chrism Mass 2024



Chrism Mass will take place on the Tuesday of Holy Week, **26th March 2024**, at **11am** in Newport Cathedral. This is an extraordinarily beautiful service at which the sacred oils are blessed – the oil of the sick, the oil of the catechumens and the holy chrism oil – and ministers of Word and Sacrament, together with the people of God, gather together around the Lord's Table to reaffirm our commitment to the ministries entrusted to us.

We encourage all priests, deacons and licensed lay ministers to attend. There will be an opportunity to renew our vows and promises as we walk with Jesus in this holiest of weeks. You are invited to robe – priests and deacons in alb and white stole, LLMs in cassock, surplice and scarf – and to stay on after the service for a buffet lunch.


Congregation members are also warmly invited to come for the service and for the buffet lunch as the Church of God, once again, recalls the salvation wrought for us in Jesus's self-offering on the cross. This is a moment in Holy Week when each of us can pause and reaffirm our commitment to take up our own cross and follow him.

Cross of Wales is a 'focus of unity' - Archbishop of Wales

The Cross of Wales, given by His Majesty King Charles as a centenary gift to the Church in Wales, was described by the Archbishop of Wales at the formal presentation last week as a "hugely significant ecumenical symbol" and a "focus of unity".

The Cross, which led the Coronation procession at Westminster Abbey on May 6, includes a relic of the True Cross, given to the King by Pope Francis to mark the Coronation.

Since the Coronation, the Cross has been in the care of the Goldsmiths' Company, who led on its commissioning, and have displayed it at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London.



It was presented to the Archbishop of Wales, Andrew John, by the Prime Warden of the Worshipful Company of Goldsmiths, Professor Charles Mackworth-Young, at a short ceremony at Goldsmiths' Hall on January 25. The retired Roman Catholic Archbishop of Cardiff, George Stack was also present.

In his speech receiving the Cross, Archbishop Andrew said, "When the Cross of Wales led the Coronation procession into Westminster Abbey on May 6th, it was a moment of huge significance in very many ways."

The Dioceses of Monmouth and Llandaff are looking to appoint a Senior Church Surveyor to lead a team which will include a Junior/Graduate Surveyor, a DAC Secretary and a Grants and Funding Officer.

This is an excellent opportunity for a dedicated professional to lead a team that will make a real difference to an exceptional group of historic buildings. Across both dioceses there are 380 church buildings. 46 of these are Grade I listed,83 Grade II*, 114 Grade II and the remainder unlisted.

The successful Senior Building Surveyor's Role

The successful Senior Church Surveyor will be responsible for a broad range of tasks, with a particular emphasis on producing quinquennial condition surveys on church buildings.
