Theology for Life

Becoming a disciple of Jesus Christ is not about making a one-off decision but about signing up to a way of life; a way of life in which we never stop learning – about ourselves, about God and about that life in all its fullness that Christ came to open up for all of us.

Theology for Life course is exactly what it says – developing an understanding of God that shapes the whole of our lives and leads us more and more into Life. Here's what one student says:

Important Updates

Churches remain closed

Plans for re-opening church buildings were discussed at the Bench of Bishop this week. There is considerable work to be done by the Church in Wales, to ensure that, when we are permitted to open by the Welsh Government, any phased re-opening is done safely to protect public health.

At present, as there is no change in the law, churches must remain closed. No date has been set for the re-opening.

A big thank-you to the Treasures who have completed the survey, this will help us to better understand how we can support parishes and MAs through this difficult time


There are still 42 surveys outstanding and these Treasurers have been emailed separately.

Covid-19 Rate Relief

For churches which operate church halls used for the assembly of visiting members of the public and where non domestic rates are paid to the local authority for the hall, you may have been notified by the local authority that it should be possible to seek relief from rates under the scheme called Retail, Leisure and Hospitality Rates Relief in Wales – 2020-21. This also applies to any shops or cafes operated by churches where rates are paid. You should contact your Local Authority rating department to make the claim. More details can be found [here](#).

Please note that places of worship are exempt from rates so this does not apply.



#BeTheLightChallenge – Nurturing Creation


We saw a lot of green thumbs this week as you all answered the challenge theme! Well done everyone! Here are a few highlights:

your chosen charity's details. The closing date for nominations is Sunday 24th May and the more nominations your chosen charity gets, the greater its chance of winning, spread the word!




