

Lent Appeal 2024 - Highveld Education

While we were in South Africa, back in November, visiting our link Diocese of The Highveld, we stopped off at Tamboville Cemetery, in Wattville, Benoni. We went to visit the grave of one of the architects of post-Apartheid South Africa, Oliver Tambo. Written on the black marble gravestone is his mantra 'Education, Education, Education'.



When looking to the future of that country, beset by troubles of violence, extreme inequality, and political disillusionment, he saw education as being key for forging new hope.



During our visit, we were privileged to see this in operation in two schools – one private and one state funded on the edge of a large township. In St Dunstan's College, the private school, two sixth form students performed a short play about inequality, corruption and disillusionment. They were engaged, passionate for equality and fairness, and it felt like we were looking at two future leaders being shaped.

A short drive away, on the edge of Etwatwa, in the Magalelagase Primary School aspirations and dreams were similarly being fostered, but the resources were far scarcer with larger class sizes. In one class, one girl spoke of her aspirations and with the right support and encouragement I pray she makes it through.





We dropped off a bag of discretely packaged sanitary products so girls like her can access their education for a new future. Dignity matters, so the discretion was important, but behind it was the vital support that The Highveld Anglican Board of Social Responsibility (HABSR) gives to such children.

In the Cathedral we entered a storeroom where we saw packages that are sent to other schools – with basic toiletries, shoes, trousers and shirts, a pencil and exercise book for children who otherwise would struggle to have what they need to study.



Part of the funds raised by the Bishop's Lent Appeal will go to help provide much needed sanitary products, pencils, school shoes and other items of the uniform so children from deprived townships in schools like the Magalelagase Primary School can access education for a new future. Please give generously and help support this important work.

Faith in Our Future Culture Day - 2nd March





For the first time, clergy and key lay people from all 16 ministry areas and the cathedral gathered together for a special networking day to help shape the culture and ethos of our churches.




Introducing the event, Bishop Cherry, said it was 'wonderful' to see all the representatives gathered and that it was a 'cause for celebration'.

She continued: "Thank you for being here. We value the views and ideas of each and every one of you... "Today, we're inviting you all to contribute to the shaping of our diocese, to the culture and ethos that we want to develop and to what you want the churches of our diocese to look and to feel like."

She explained that the Culture Guide "is not so much about what we're doing as disciples and church communities, but about who we are, how we behave towards one another, and what people experience when they meet us."

The group, which included clergy, lay co-chairs, ministry area wardens, treasurers, property leads, lay licensed ministers and ministry area safeguarding officers, was inspired by Mandy Bayton, Director for Evangelism for the Church in Wales, who gave two thought-provoking addresses, before the group was divided into smaller working groups to explore the Culture Guide more closely.





Each group was given one of the six values identified in the guide to discuss it in more practical detail for their roles, ministry areas and churches. The values are – love; generosity; joy; humility; courage and integrity.

There was a buzz of excitement around St Teilos High School as the discussions continued over Welsh cakes during the coffee break, before the day closed with uplifting worship – including a sermon from Mandy Bayton.



The Culture Guide builds on the diocesan vision, which was launched in 2022 - put simply, the vision is about doing and the culture guide is about being. The guide is available here.

Chrism Mass 2024 - Last Chance to Book



Chrism Mass will take place on the Tuesday of Holy Week, **26th March 2024**, at **11am** in Newport Cathedral. This is an extraordinarily beautiful service at which the sacred oils are blessed – the oil of the sick, the oil of the catechumens and the holy chrism oil – and ministers of Word and Sacrament, together with the people of God, gather together around the Lord's Table to reaffirm our commitment to the ministries entrusted to us.

We encourage all priests, deacons and licensed lay ministers to attend. There will be an opportunity to renew our vows and promises as we walk with Jesus in this holiest of weeks. You are invited to robe – priests and deacons in alb and white stole, LLMs in cassock, surplice and scarf – and to stay on after the service for a buffet lunch.

Congregation members are also warmly invited to come for the service and for the buffet lunch as the Church of God, once again, recalls the salvation wrought for us in Jesus's self-offering on the cross. This is a moment in Holy Week when each of

us can pause and reaffirm our commitment to take up our own cross and follow him.

Changes at the Cathedral



The RB's new Partnership Funding has enabled a review of roles at the Cathedral. One of these roles will be wholly focused on the Cathedral, and the new funding will enable the Cathedral to improve its support for the wider priorities of the diocese through an additional post.

Under these changes, Canon Andrew Lightbown will become Canon for Mission: Cathedral and City, focusing on the missionary and evangelistic life of the Cathedral internally (40%) and looking beyond the walls to extend the mission of the Mother Church into the city (60%). It will build on the work Canon Andrew has been doing in the city and incorporate his role as Bishop's Officer for Ecumenical and Interfaith relations.

The Cathedral new role will be Canon for Worship (40%) and Congregational Life (60%). This combines the traditional roles of Canon Precentor and Pastor. This role is now being advertised and further details are in the link in the advert below.

Welcoming this development, Bishop Cherry said, 'This new money, made available to all the Cathedrals in Wales, provides us with an opportunity to raise the profile, presence and impact of the Cathedral in the life of the city and the diocese in a significant way. Andrew's work to date provides an excellent platform on which he and others can build to further the mission of the church and our service to the city.'

The Dean, Very Revd Ian Black, commented that, these changes "enable us to better serve both the needs of the congregational life and the wider mission of the Cathedral in the city and diocese. Canon Andrew is a natural networker. He has established fruitful relationships among people and groups not otherwise in touch with the Cathedral. This role enables us to develop our mission in the city of Newport in collaboration with the respective Ministry Areas.

The Canon for Worship and Congregational Life will enable us to develop the life of the congregations and improve how we welcome and serve the many people from the diocese and beyond who come to the Cathedral. The role of Precentor is one I have been fulfilling as Dean, and being released from it will enable me to be able to get round the diocese more."

Canon Andrew said, 'I am delighted to be offered this new and exciting opportunity which is in many ways a natural evolution of my existing role. I am grateful for all of the support that I have received since joining the cathedral and the diocese two years ago. I feel a deep sense of love for the City of Newport, the Cathedral and indeed the wider diocese and hope that this informs all that we do going forward.'

Suicide Awareness Training for Clergy

Further details will follow however we are highlighting this training now so you can put the date in your diaries. Two training sessions will be held in All Saints Church, Brynglas, Newport. Each sessions is limited to 20 people.

Suicide obviously has massive pastoral implications and the sessions will involve understanding statistics about suicide, the impact of suicide and risk factors for those who might experience thoughts of suicide. They will also assist people in being equipped with a 3 part suicide intervention conversation structure that would support someone in crisis.

The sessions will be led by Susie Mapledoram who is an instructor with the National Centre for Suicide Prevention, Education and Training.

They will be held on October 2nd from 12.30pm to 4.30pm and October 3rd from 9.00am to 1.00pm.
