Lent Appeal 2024

During Lent this year, you have read about the projects in the Highveld supported by the Highveld Anglican Board of Social Responsibility (HABSR). Some of these projects were visited during November 2023, however, it was impossible to see all of them during the six days spent there. Many other projects and social problems which come under HABSR's remit require funding.

In isolated areas like Mayflower and Standerton, members of the communities are trained as Home Based Carers. Mobile clinics are sent out once or twice a month by the authorities but the HBC's are needed to assist on a day to day basis, offering care for the sick and dying and collecting and delivering medication. Orphans and vulnerable children are also identified by the HBC's and are referred to HABSR, where Child Care Advocates will attend to the needs of these youngsters. In these areas, the population exceeds 100,000 but basic services like water, sanitation and waste removal are not provided.

Mayflower has one of the highest rates of unemployment, particularly amongst young people. During our visit we were invited into a tiny house furnished with only the most basic necessities, where eleven members of one family lived, none of whom are employed. We all found it heart-rending to see the conditions in which the mother, daughters and grandchildren (babes-in-arms) were living. It was the youngest daughter, a teenager, who spoke for the family members and has taken over the main responsibility for their care. This is just one of many, many families that HABSR helps to support.

One of the aspirations of HABSR is to find ways to train young people to become self-sufficient and not have to depend on charity; to create job opportunities, to eradicate poverty and enable them to sustain themselves.



Themba Khosa, the Programme Manager, is creating a group of businessmen, doctors and members of the police force, amongst others, to provide training schemes. During our visit, we met people who are already helping to achieve this in a small way. Father Garry and Don King both have backgrounds in farming and food production and are providing opportunities for young people to learn skills in these areas. They are also setting up Community Gardens to grow food that can be accessed by all, including the Early Childhood Centres and Safe Parks. HABSR also enables young people, who are unable to fund themselves, to access further education. The work of outreach is carried out by many parishes and supported by HABSR, when needed. Three times a week, the parish of All Souls, Benoni, linked with St. Cadoc's, Caerleon, feeds approximately sixty people, who gather at the gate of the church. They distribute food parcels from their Soup Kitchen to the needy in the community and to the homeless. Katlehong Primary School also benefits from their help and has received school bags and stationery items, when required.





The work carried out by HABSR goes far beyond providing Soup Kitchens, school uniforms and sanitary products.

They are also involved in providing training and counselling on Gender-Based Violence.

People living with albinism are marginalised and abused on a daily basis and HABSR is supporting them, as well as providing education to eradicate the stigma and violation associated with this condition. They provide dignity packs, food parcels and clothing, including caps and sunglasses to help protect them from the sun.

On behalf of HABSR, Themba and his colleagues are also involved with very sensitive cases, including child abuse and where families find difficulty in accessing government help. They work to get justice and aid for these families who are struggling.

The work carried out by the Highveld Board of Social Responsibility is vast and far-reaching. The challenges are enormous, due to the unbelievable number of people who need their help. We met present day saints, who deprive themselves to help others.



Nomsa, runs Little Angels Nursery, and on our visit in 2017 was also running a Soup Kitchen from her home. The ladies at the Soup Kitchen at Christ the King, Tembisa West, fund meals from their own meagre pockets, if no other funding is available.

We, as a companion diocese, can help HABSR to alleviate some of these problems and enable their essential work to continue by being generous in our support of Bishop Cherry's Lent Appeal.

New Church Community Hubs



You are likely to have already heard something about our diocesan evangelism project but, now that funding is secured, we want to share with you some details so that you have a better understanding of what is planned. This is an exciting project for the whole diocese, and we hope that you will all share in that excitement as we bring more people to faith and look to welcome new worshippers to the diocesan family.

Monmouth Diocese is planting four new church communities, aimed primarily at bringing under-40s to faith. The first two will be launched this year in Chepstow and Tredegar, with the remaining two following in 2026 (locations to be decided). The churches will be focused on sharing the gospel message with the community and creating a 'family' within the church for everyone to belong to – including lots of under 40s.

The landmark £3m project was announced at the start of the year and young people and families will be the focus. The funding comes from the Church in Wales' Evangelism Fund, set up six years ago for diocesan projects to help people engage with the Christian faith in new and exciting ways.

Work on the project has already begun and we are looking for a great team to establish these new worshipping communities, drawing children and families into faith and discipleship.

Journey to Net Zero



Along with the rest of the Church in Wales, we are working to become Net Zero through a series of steps. This will involve the diocesan office, parsonages, churches and churchyards which form part of our wider culture as a diocese and province.

The next step of this journey is to identify the churches in the diocese who have the largest carbon footprint so that resources that can be prioritised where they can have the most impact. This will be done by completing the Church in Wales Energy Footprint Tool which is a simple online survey. We are mindful that we don't want to create extra work for any of our clergy or volunteers so we are completing as much of this form as we can on behalf of our churches.

Through discussions with Ministry Area Leaders, we have a list of the churches that we think have a high energy footprint, based on their size and how often they are used. We would like to start completing the Energy Footprint Tool for these churches. Although we can do the majority of the work, we might be contacting treasurers to ask for some information about energy bills. This will involve asking for a copy of your latest bill and some brief information around your tariff.

Although we are prioritising our largest churches for now, all our churches can complete the Energy Footprint Tool. You might be interested to discover the carbon footprint of your church!

There will also be a panel discussion/Q&A on the role of the church alongside public and third sector organisations,


Lunch will be provided.
